U.S. Figure Skating



The 2009 U.S. Figure Skating Qualifying Competition Season consists of a total of 14 events. These include 12 qualifying events (9 Regional Championships, 3 Sectional Championships), the 2009 U.S. Junior Championships (Juvenile & Intermediate) and the 2009 U.S. Figure Skating Championships (Novice, Junior & Senior). All 14 events are sanctioned by U.S. Figure Skating and conducted according to the most current U.S. Figure Skating rulebook, 2009 edition, with changes and clarifications as posted on the U.S. Figure Skating website and this announcement. Compliance with these rules as updated or amended is the responsibility of the participants. U.S. Figure Skating reserves the right to incorporate revisions to the International Judging System (IJS) made by the ISU for junior and senior events and by U.S. Figure Skating to novice events and below.

The Qualifying and National Championship Competitions are only open to competitors who are:

(1) Current members of U.S. Figure Skating, (2) Who meet the eligibility requirements according to U.S. Figure Skating Rule 3035, (3) Who meet all age and test requirements pertaining to the event you are entering, and (4) Who meet the citizen and residency requirements as stated in Rule 3065.

Non-U.S. Citizens who have already received a letter of permission from the Chair of the Competitions Committee and were accepted to compete in the U.S. Figure Skating qualifying system are eligible to register. All other non-US citizens seeking eligibility must meet the requirements set forth in Rule 3065.

Any coach being credentialed at a U.S. Figure Skating competition is required to be a current member in good standing of both U.S. Figure Skating and the Professional Skaters Association (PSA). Additionally, all coaches will have to comply with the coach's registration policy in order to be allowed to instruct/coach at all qualifying competitions. Coaches will need to check-in at the registration desk and show proof of registration plus membership in both U.S. Figure Skating and the PSA in order to receive a credential. Each LOC will ask to see a registration and membership card from every coach at check-in. A list of all coaches who have successfully registered will be available at <http://www.usfigureskating.org/content/2008-09%20Registered%20Coaches.pdf>. If they have not successfully completed registration, they will not be allowed a credential. No exceptions.



Important Notice for all Pairs and Dance Teams

All pairs and dance teams will begin their qualifying at their respective sectional championships (unless they have been notified of a bye advancing them directly to the U.S. Championships). These events will no longer be offered at the regional championships.

For all juvenile and intermediate pairs and dance teams, it is a requirement (not an option like 2008) for the 2009 qualifying season that all of these teams compete at the sectional championships. The top eight teams from each sectional championship will advance to the 2009 U.S. Junior Championships.

REGISTRATION

METHOD

Online Electronic Registration (Required)

Online registration is the ONLY method available for entry into the 2009 U.S. Figure Skating Qualifying Competition Season. All competitors competing at the sectional championships had to register for the 2009 Qualifying Competition Season by the deadline of September 1, 2008.

To update all mandatory forms (Planned Program Content Form, Competition Music Form, Medical Registry, Media Form) for the 2009 Qualifying Competition Season, proceed in the following manner:

Log onto www.usfsaonline.org

Click on “Online Event Reg” then “Event Manager”

BYES

No medical byes will be considered. Competitors awarded a bye to their sectional championships or the U.S. Championships will receive official notification in writing from U.S. Figure Skating. However, all competitors, including those who receive a bye, wishing to compete in the 2009 Qualifying Competition Season must enter by the Sept. 1, 2008 deadline.

ENTRY FEES

Sectional Championships Qualifying Entry Fees

Singles skaters advancing from their regional championships to the sectional championships will incur an additional \$150.00 (one hundred fifty dollars) entry fee plus \$10.00 (ten dollars) administrative fee. This total will automatically be charged to the credit card that paid the initial regional fee.

All pairs and dance teams were charged the \$150 entry fee plus administrative fee during the initial registration process and therefore no additional entry fee for these teams will be charged. Singles skaters who receive a bye from their regional championships directly to the sectional championships will only be charged the sectional entry fee of \$150.00 plus the \$10 administrative fee. Those who received a late bye after the close of entries and paid the \$130 entry fee (and the administrative fee) will be charged an additional \$20 to cover the cost of the sectional entry fee.

Your registration fee is not considered valid until all appropriate entry and administrative fees have been paid and all required forms have been completed online to U.S. Figure Skating.



PAYMENT

Online payment via credit card is the ONLY accepted form of payment.

For those competitors advancing to the sectional championships from the regional championships, the credit card used during the initial entry registration will be automatically charged the additional sectional entry fee. If an alternative card must be used for the sectional entry fee, please contact Lindsay Mulvey, U.S. Figure Skating, at 719.635.5200.

Withdrawals

Once entered, all withdrawals are considered final. A skater may not reenter even if the withdrawal occurs prior to the entry deadline on Sept. 1, 2008.

TECHNICAL DETAILS

CONDUCT OF EVENTS

For the 2009 season, all events and levels at all championship competitions (regionals, sectionals, U.S. Junior Championships, U.S. Championships) will be conducted in accordance with the International Judging System (IJS).

AGE and TEST QUALIFICATIONS

All age and test requirements can be found in the U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook starting with Rule 3640 (senior singles) and on the U.S. Figure Skating website at http://www.usfigureskating.org/New_Judging.asp?id=311.

TECHNICAL ELEMENTS

The well-balanced program charts for all levels and disciplines are posted on the U.S. Figure Skating website at http://www.usfigureskating.org/New_Judging.asp?id=311. As referenced earlier in this announcement, U.S. Figure Skating will incorporate all changes made by the ISU in regards to well-balanced programs. Please refer to this website often for continuous updates.

PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT SHEET

All competitors entering into the 2009 Qualifying Competition Season are required as part of their online registration to submit a planned program content sheet (PPCS) detailing the elements in their program(s). You may update your PPCS at www.usfsaonline.org up to one week prior to the start of your competition.



MUSIC

COMPETITION MUSIC INFORMATION (Required component of online registration)

U.S. Figure Skating requires all competitors to fully complete a competition music information form as part of the online registration process.

The following information is required for each piece of music used in the composition of the short program/original dance and free skate/free dance: Composer, Orchestra, Duration of Music, Record Label/Number (Optional but highly recommended if obtainable).

COMPACT DISCS (CD'S)

For all qualifying events during the 2009 season, CDs are the only acceptable forms of media. **Cassettes will NOT be accepted.** CDs must be clearly marked with name, event entered and the music length. **Each CD must have only ONE (1) track on it. In the case of short and long programs, two (2) separate discs must be used.** Any disc with more than one (1) track will NOT be accepted! Lead in time (time before the music begins) on CDs may not exceed two (2) seconds. Each CD must be in a standard hard sided "jewel case" or CD sleeve, also labeled with the skater's name and event. Jewel cases and CDs that are not properly identified will NOT be accepted. **Due to compatibility and reliability reasons music may NOT be submitted on re-recordable "CD-RW" discs.** Competition music must be turned in at the registration desk at the time of registration. At the sectional championships, competitors will not receive their credentials at registration until they turn in their music. The originals used at sectionals will be forwarded on to the U.S. Junior Championships/U.S. Championships for those advancing. It is also imperative that all skaters bring original copies of their music to the U.S. Junior Championships/U.S. Championships if so advancing.

All competitors must have at least one (1) additional copy rinkside at practice sessions and during the actual competition event. The LOC will accept no responsibility for damage or loss.

U.S. Figure Skating will supply current dance music for compulsory dances.



ADVANCEMENT TO U.S. JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS (Lake Placid)/U.S. CHAMPIONSHIPS (Cleveland)

QUALIFIERS

For all competitors advancing to the U.S. Championships

Representatives from the 2009 U.S. Figure Skating Championships will be present to distribute information packets, ensure that all competitors advancing receive and submit the required information and answer any other questions pertaining to the Championships in Cleveland, Ohio. The National Championships Room at each sectional championship has been assigned for those skaters advancing to the U.S. Championships.

Representatives from the Local Organizing Committee and U.S. Figure Skating shall be available to assist.

The fifth and sixth place finishers in singles and pairs and dance for novice/junior/senior level competitors are the first and second alternates to the U.S. Championships. They will receive their announcement on site but do not need to submit any paperwork unless contacted by U.S. Figure Skating.

Juvenile and Intermediate Pairs and Dance (New)

New for the 2009 Qualifying Competition Season, all juvenile and intermediate pairs and dance will have their first competition at the sectional championships rather than the regional championships. The top 8 placed teams at each sectional championships will advance to the U.S. Junior Championships. All teams advancing will receive instructions for downloading the Junior Championships announcement from www.usfsaonline.org.

The ninth and tenth place teams at each sectional championships will be considered the first and second alternates for the U.S. Junior Championships. They will receive instructions for downloading the announcement but do not need to submit any paperwork unless contacted by U.S. Figure Skating.

Alternates do not need to mail in any paperwork or required forms unless contacted by U.S. Figure Skating.

MEDICAL SERVICES

Medical personnel will be on-site during the competition and will assist with immediate medical needs. If necessary, 911 will be called. The nearest hospital, Methodist Sugar Land Hospital, is 1.8 miles from the arena.

REGISTRATION

The registration desk at the Sugar Land Ice & Sports Center will be open throughout the week. Competitors should check-in at the registration desk upon their arrival to receive their credentials and other important information. Registration will be open on Tuesday, Nov. 11, 2008 from 11:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. Thereafter the registration desk will open one hour prior to the start of the competition and remain open until the close of events daily.

DEADLINES

Please read the announcement and accompanying forms very carefully and be sure that all deadlines are met. All photos, practice ice requests, and accreditation requests must be sent to the registrar and postmarked not later than the Tuesday (Upper Great Lakes) or Thursday (Eastern Great Lakes, Southwesterns) following the conclusion of applicable regional championships.

DO NOT use any form of mail or delivery service that would require a signature for delivery. Such requirement will cause significant delays in delivery. Should you have any question regarding what is required, please feel free to contact us.

Any information postmarked after the Tuesday (UGL) or Thursday (EGL, SW) following your regional championships will be accepted ONLY at the discretion of the local organizing committee.

INSURANCE/LIABILITY

U.S. Figure Skating, the host club(s) and/or interclub association, the organizing committee, and the ice arenas being utilized for these events accept no responsibility for injury or damage sustained by any participant in these championships (U.S. Figure Skating Rule 3222).



ANTI DOPING

Anti-Doping tests will be conducted at the U.S. Figure Skating Championships, held in Cleveland, Ohio, January 18-25, 2009. Senior level competitors only are eligible to be tested. If selected, testing is mandatory.

PRACTICE ICE (See Form B)

Practice ice sessions will begin on Tuesday, Nov.11, 2008 at 8:00 a.m. All official practice ice sessions will be 30 minutes long and music can be played. One 20-minute warm-up session will be provided on the day of the competition without music. These two ice times (50 minutes total) will be given for each event entered (i.e. ladies get two (2) warm-ups and two (2) 30-minute practices, as they have a short and long event). All official practice ice will be sold as a package (\$75 per singles competitor and \$50 per each pairs/dance competitor).

Unofficial practice ice sessions may be purchased at a rate of \$20 per 30 minutes for singles competitors or \$15 per 30 minutes for pairs/dance competitors per competitor (team total \$30). No music will be played on unofficial practice ice. Competitors may purchase more than one unofficial practice ice however all prepurchased packages will receive priority. The enclosed form (Form B) must be completed and submitted with a check to guarantee official, and if requested, unofficial practice ice. Please make check payable to “Mids 2009 – LOC” and include with your entry packet. A schedule will be posted online as soon as it is available – please check the website at www.mids2009.com often for updates and information. PHOTOGRAPHY/VIDEO.

Competition performance videotaping and DVD sales will be provided by the official videographer assigned by U.S. Figure Skating. The LOC is not responsible for any arrangements made with the official videographer.

All U.S. Figure Skating Championship Competitions (including regionals, sectionals, U.S. Junior Championships, and U.S. Championships) will be professionally videotaped and photographed. Videotaping of the competition in any form is not permitted. Photographs are permitted for personal use only, but for the safety of the skaters, **no flash photography** is allowed. Any resale of photography is strictly prohibited.

AWARDS

Medals will be awarded to the first through fourth place finishers and trophies will be awarded to the first place winners. All awards will be presented off ice at the official photographer's table immediately following the final results for that event. Competitors are required to be in competition outfit and skates for the awards ceremony.

OFFICIAL PROGRAM AND MEDIA INFORMATION

All qualifying skaters, whether advancing through a BYE or advancement from the regional championships, are required to provide two (5"x7") head/shoulder photos labeled with the name of the competitor(s), home club, event level, and coach. Preferred forms are electronic media (i.e. jpeg files via email or on a CD). Submission of the photos and media information must be emailed or postmarked no later than the Tuesday following your regional championship.

OFFICIAL MERCHANDISE (See Form D)

2009 Midwestern Sectional U.S. Figure Skating apparel will be available for purchase in the lobby. However, we ask that you pre-order your Official merchandise in order to ensure receiving the proper size/selection. See Form D for details. CREREDENTIALS (See Form A)

Security will be on hand and entry will be limited to credentialed and ticketed individuals only.

Chaperone Credentials: Each skater may name one chaperone to receive credentials free of charge. One additional chaperone credential may be purchased for \$40.00. Chaperones will not have access to skater locker rooms or staging areas.

Coaches Credentials: Each singles entrant may designate a maximum of two coaches for credentials; each pair and dance team may designate a maximum of three coaches for credentials. One coach credential per competitor will be provided free of charge; all others are \$40.00 each. All coaches must be current U.S. Figure Skating and PSA members in good standing and show proof of coach's registration in order to be credentialed. Coaching credentials will allow access to all venue areas, including coaches hospitality.

Changes: Changes to chaperone and or coach designations may be made at the registration desk. Competitors will be limited to one chaperone and one coach designation change. Only a skater who is not a minor, or a parent or legal guardian of a minor skater may designate or change an official chaperone or coach.

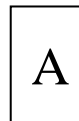


TRAVEL

All competitors, chaperones, and coaches will be responsible for their own transportation. There are two major airports which service the Houston/Sugar Land area, they are William P. Hobby Airport “Hobby” (HOU) 29.2 miles and approximately 35 minutes from the rink and Bush Intercontinental Airport (IAH) 43.1 miles and approximately 50 minutes from the rink. Both have most national car rental services. Keep in mind that traffic can be an issue so allow for plenty of time.
